Changing of the guard

Stan is putting on Incoming President's training on Saturday, June 21, at the Lake Anna YMCA, 500 W. Hopocan Ave, Barberton, Ohio 44203. Time, etc, will be sent out by Stan later, there is no charge to attend. Please have your next president chosen by then and informed about the training date. Sometimes a "new" president has served before in that capacity and feels there is no need to repeat the training. There is always new material and attending anyway is recommended. Last year several clubs told me they do not do their elections until June, but having it done and recorded online by June 1 is actually the policy. In case we did not mention this before, at the February meeting, Tim Crawford of Norton was elected to be the Lt. Governor for 2015-2016, following Stan Popp of the Wooster Club who is to serve as Lt. Governor 2014-2015. In Stan's year, Leroy Martin has volunteered to stay on as Division Treasurer and Kip Crain has offered to be Division Secretary one more year.

We had an interesting Division meeting in March, a speaker from Akron Children's Hospital showed us plans for a new addition to the hospital and to Ronald McDonald House. Past Lt. Gov.
